



Notice of Public Community Hearing

The Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board (Review Board) is holding a public community hearing in Fort Simpson on Tuesday, April 25th to discuss the Prairie Creek All-Season Road Project.

The project consists of the construction, operation and closure of a 184 km all season access road from the Prairie Creek Lead and Zinc Mine to the Liard Hwy. All season road construction is proposed over 3 years, with an operating life of 17 years followed by road closure and reclamation. The proposed road passes through ~85km of the Nahanni National Park and Reserve.

The Review Board wants to hear evidence from all parties as well as the views of the public about the proposed development's impacts on the environment including the social, cultural and economic well-being of the residents of the Mackenzie Valley.
