RE: Notification pursuant to s. 79 of the Species at Risk Act (SARA)

Please be advised that the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board (Review Board) is undertaking an environmental assessment (EA) the Howard's Pass Access Road Upgrade Project, proposed by Selwyn Chihong Mining Ltd. This EA was referred to the Review Board on July 10, 2015 by Parks Canada pursuant to section 126 (2) (a) of the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*. The Review Board has created a <u>public registry</u> for this file, where all information will be stored and available for public review.

Based on information in the Developer's *Project Description Report*, this development may adversely affect the species listed in Table 1 below. These species have been identified as being at risk under either SARA, by the Committee on the Status of Endangered Wildlife in Canada or by the NWT Species at Risk Act.

The Review Board is providing this information to discharge its duties under s.79 of SARA, which requires that notification be made to the appropriate responsible minister when any project could have an impact on a species at risk. Environment Canada is asked to assist the Review Board in determining the likelihood of adverse effects of the proposed project on the species listed below and any other species that Environment Canada identifies as being at risk and/or their critical habitats through participation in the EA process.
