Good afternoon Chuck,

Please find attached a resolution agreed at the DFN leadership meeting last week. The resolution is intended to confirm regional aboriginal support for the all season road, and accommodate the road in proposed land use plans.

While there is currently no conflict between the road and withdrawn lands, the purpose of including the road in the withdrawn lands is to provide for a private road designation following land claims settlement, which will confirm and continue the ability of Nahanni Butte to control access to authorized users.
