Re: Timelines to date for the Prairie Creek All-Season Road and Airstrip Project in accordance with 2014 amendments to the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act

Dear Mr. Harpley:

On March 25, 2014 amendments to the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act* (the Act) received royal assent. The amended Act now sets out time limits for the Review Board and Responsible Ministers for environmental assessments.

The purpose of this letter is to describe the amount of time spent to date for this environmental assessment. The Prairie Creek All-Season Road and Airstrip Project is an environmental assessment with a hearing. In accordance with the Act, the Review Board has 16 months and the Minister five months, for a total of 21 months, to complete the environmental assessment. These time limits do not include the time you use to provide information or conduct studies.

The following table outlines time spent by the Review Board, the developer and the Minister for the Prairie Creek All-Season Road and Airstrip Project from May 22 – June 26, 2014:
