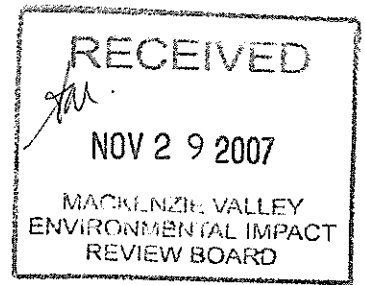

This letter is further to our first workshop, held in Yellowknife held on October 4, 2007, where we provided you with a broad overview of the proposed Gahcho Kué project and introduced the key members of our permitting team.

At that workshop, we were asked by a number of participants to provide a copy of the Gahcho Kué Project Information Overview Video which we played, and to provide a copy of the power point presentation we used to give more specifics regarding the water management and waste management aspects of the proposed project.

Enclosed is a DVD which has both the above items. As noted in the meeting on October 4th, the Gahcho Kué Project Information Overview Video was produced in December 2005 and since that time, the ownership has changed. The project is now a joint venture between De Beers Canada Inc. (51%) and Mountain Province Diamonds Inc. (49%). The information regarding the ownership of the project is now outdated on the DVD. We have also added a couple slides in the power point presentation to address questions we had in the meeting, so that you have this information at hand.

Since our meeting on the 4th of October, we have received the final Terms of Reference from the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board, and we are reviewing these now.

As we finalize our Environmental Impact Statement, our Public & Corporate Affairs department will be putting together new information to compliment the Environmental Impact Statement, including an updated DVD regarding the proposed project. When these new communications tools become available, we will ensure you receive a copy of all materials.
