Complete Application, Type "A" - Mineral Exploration - Meridian Lake

This acknowledges receipt of your land use application on May 5, 2004. The Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board and staff will be processing your application as per Section 22 (1)(b) of the Mackenzie Valley Land Use Regulations.

Within forty-two (42) days of the date of this letter, the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board will take one of the following actions:

- 1. Issue a Type "A" permit, subject to any conditions included pursuant to Subsection 26(1);
- 2. order, pursuant to Subsection 24(1) of the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*, that a hearing be held or further studies or investigations be made respecting the lands proposed to be used in the land-use operation;
- 3. refer the application to the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board for an environmental assessment pursuant to Subsection 125(1) of the Act: or
- 4. where a requirement set out in Section 61 or 62 of the *Act* has not been met, refuse to issue a permit.



RE: FORTUNE MINERALS APPLICATION FOR NEW LAND USE PERMIT

Dear Mr. Sayine,

I am writing on behalf of Fortune Minerals Limited to initiate community consultation in conjunction with our application for a new land use permit for a small land claim along the south shoreline of the East Arm of Great Slave Lake. More specifically, the **Slave** claims are along the north shore of Meridian Lake and consist of 2 contiguous blocks covering roughly 2050 hectares, approximately 70 kilometres northeast of Lutselk'e and 10 kilometres southwest of Reliance (Figures 1 & 2).

Fortune Minerals has a history of working in the Northwest Territories with one project already at an advanced stage of exploration. It is referred to as NICO and is situated in the Tli Cho settlement area, 60 kilometres northwest of Yellowknife. Fortune Minerals has a good working relationship with the Dogrib Treaty 11 First Nation and has hired several people from these communities.

Fortune Minerals proposes to conduct exploration activities under the new land use permit that would include:

- geological mapping and sampling
- line-cutting over mineralized areas
- detailed mapping, sampling and geophysical surveying
- Diamond drilling in the late summer of 2004

The duration of the land use permit is 5 years and would be extended based on results of diamond drilling. A small camp would be established initially with potential for growth based on the results of early exploration. There will be little to no impact on the environment due to the preliminary nature of the exploration programs.
