Dear Dr. Chris Wilson,

On September 9, 2007, the Mackenzie Valley Environmental Impact Review Board referred Hunter Bay Resources' proposed mineral exploration program at Great Bear Lake to environmental assessment. The referral was made on the Review Board's own motion. Environmental assessments in the NWT are conducted under the authority of the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*, using rules and procedures set out in the Environmental Impact Assessment Guidelines, established under *MVRMA* section 120.

As set out in the EIA Guidelines, as well as in the Draft Workplan for EA0708-006 Hunter Bay Resources Mineral Exploration, there are various roles and responsibilities for the developer, parties and the Review Board. The role of the developer is to design and describe the development, potential impacts and mitigation strategies for those impacts, and to provide the Review Board with this information.

On January 21, 2008, I contacted you by email and requested the following information:

- Please describe all work done at the Sloan drill target at Edaiila (MacTavish Arm) on Great Bear Lake. Indicate what proportion of Hunter Bay's planned drilling activities at the Sloan target this work represents. This does not include any information on drilling results.
- Please confirm that Hunter Bay Resources has not yet completed its proposed activities for the Sloan target, and that Hunter Bay Resources plans to complete the exploration program upon completion of the environmental assessment and receipt of a valid land use permit.
