As you are aware, on October 22, 2013, the Minister of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development, on his own behalf as federal Minister and on behalf of the other responsible ministers (the "Ministers") with jurisdiction in relation to the project (the Ministers of Natural Resources, Fisheries and Oceans, and Transport as well as the Government of the Northwest Territories), conveyed the Ministers' decision to adopt the Gahcho Kué Review Panel's (the "Panel") recommendation that the project be approved subject to the implementation of the measures, follow-up programs and developer commitments contained in the Report.
