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Northern Participant Funding Program

The Northern Participant Funding Program is funded from December 19, 2018 to March 31, 2023

> Funding Level: \$10.3 million over 5 years \$150,000 cap per recipient, per project, per year.

- Supports Indigenous governments and organizations, and northerners to facilitate their meaningful participation in the environmental assessment processes established under land claims agreements in Canada's three territories
- Funding is made available for environmental assessments of large, complex or controversial resource development or regional infrastructure projects (i.e., "major" projects)





Who is eligible?

Participant Requirements

The Applicant must demonstrate that they meet **at least one** of the following criteria:

- Have a direct, local interest in the development, such as living or owning property in the development area;
- Have an interest in potential impacts to related claims and rights;
- Have Indigenous Knowledge, Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, Indigenous perspective, or community knowledge relevant to the environmental assessment; or
- Plan to provide expert information relevant to the anticipated environmental impacts of the development.



What are the expense categories?

Eligible expenses include:

□ travel expenses (includes transportation and accommodation)
□ professional fees (e.g. consultants, lawyers, Honoraria),
□ non-core staff salaries,
□ office supplies or telephone charges, and
□ media advertising, and promotion.

Please note that core operations and maintenance expenses are not eligible for funding under the program.



What activities may be funded?

The following activities may be considered for funding:

□ technical reviews of information
□ research
□ data collection
□ community meetings
□ honoraria
□ collection, translation, documentation or transmission of Indigenous knowledge
□ preparation of submissions and presentations
□ preparation of witnesses
□ retention of experts, including legal representation




Funding call open! From June 29th - July 27th

The waste management facility will also be used for long-term storage of materials contaminated by the oilfield during the final closure and reclamation of the Norman Wells Operation.


