Some of her previous experience includes the Community Outreach Coordinator with the Land and Water Boards of the Mackenzie Valley, Chief Executive Officer of the Dene Nation and Assembly of First Nations Regional Office (NWT), Senior Advisor at the NWT and Nunavut Chamber of Mines, Senior Administrative Coordinator for the Department of Lands, in addition to other positions within the GNWT.

In this new role with MVEIRB, she will be working on community engagement initiatives including delivering community workshops and presentations.
