The Review Board considered Canadian Zinc Corporation's development proposal at their October 30 meeting and instructed staff to undertake two separate environmental assessments (EA). One EA will cover the scope of the fuel cache clean up, the other, the drilling program. Draft work plan's for the EA's are being considered by the Review Board at their mid-month meeting meeting in Yellowknife. Please call me at 867-873-9189 to discuss the EA.

Now, the plain English version. Canadian Zinc Corporation wants to drill six or seven holes near the mine and fix up a tote road to haul petroleum products back to the mine site. the development got referred to environmental assessment. The Review Board considered the development and said, this is better dealt with as two separate developments. Now we have two EA's. One for the fuel clean up, one for the drilling program.
