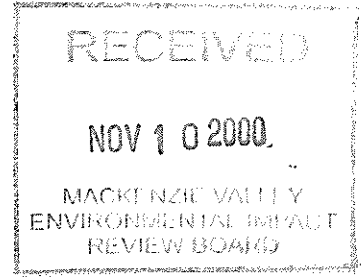

Subject: Prairie Creek Draft ToR & Work Plan



Louie:

I have reviewed the Draft Work Plan and Terms of Reference dated November 6, 2000 for the two EA's to be conducted further to Canadian Zinc's Land Use Application to undertake Mineral Exploration and the Cat Camp Fuel Cache Recovery and Clean-up.

I have one factual clarification to make that is relevant to each of the two Terms of Reference documents.

The last sentence in the first paragraph of the Introduction in each of the ToR's (lines 7-8 and 6-7, respectively) states:

"CZN recently acquired the Prairie Creek lead-zinc mine, after its previous owner, San Andreas Resources, went into receivership"

In actual fact, San Andreas Resources Corporation changed its name to Canadian Zinc Corporation on May 25, 1999 under the Company Act of British Columbia. San Andreas Resources had previously acquired the property from Nanisivik Mines Ltd. in 1993. It was Cadillac Explorations Limited that originally developed the property and subsequently went bankrupt in 1982.

I suggest the wording of this statement be changed to reflect more accurately the actual sequence of ownership and ensure that the public is not falsely led to believe that San Andreas Resources went bankrupt, which is not the case. This is an important consideration since the Prairie Creek Development Cooperation Agreement was negotiated by and executed on behalf of the Nahanni Butte Dene Band and San Andreas Resources, and as such remains valid and legally binding upon Canadian Zinc by virtue of the name change.

I appreciate the opportunity to review the draft documents and look forward to working with you to complete the EA's.
