The Fort Norman Metis Land corporation would like to make the following comments pertaining to the Land Use Permit and Water Licence application made by Northrock Resources for the Summit Creek Drilling Project.

- 1. We disagree with the proposed access route and would strongly suggest that Northrock Resources utilize the existing staging site at Little Bear River and the existing access route. Our concerns with the proposed access route is the ice crossing which we believe to be unstable, and there will be a requirement to cut a second growth area on the route which increases the possibility of erosion. By utilizing the existing staging and access route, Northrock will be using a route that they used in prior years to get to their exact drilling site. Further, we do not support the opening of new access routes when existing are established.
- 2. Community members have raised concerns about the disturbance of an area that has cultural significance. This would have to be further investigated.
- 3. The issue of harvesters' compensation has not been dealt with by Northrock. As per Chapter 18 of the Sahun Dene and Metis Comprehensive Land Claim Agreement, the developer must deal with the individual harvester, and this has not happened.

We appreciate the opportunity to comment on the above application.



The Sahtu Land Use Planning Board has reviewed the land use permit application submitted by Northrock Resources Ltd. on September 13, 2002 and referred to us by your office on September 30, 2002. The Sahtu Land Use Planning Board hereby certifies that there is no approved land use plan for the area affected by the above captioned application. On behalf of the Sahtu Land Use Planning Board, I confirm that the Sahtu Land and Water Board has met the referral obligations to our Board as outlined in the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act.

While there is not currently a land use plan in effect for the area in question, our land use planning process has identified areas of considerable importance to the people of the Sahtu. Two individual areas are of concern in the proposed Land Use Permit Application. The area encompassing Stewart Lake, Tate Lake and Little Bear River is noted as an Intensive Traditional Use Area, which falls under the Special Management Areas category of the preliminary Draft Sahtu Land Use Plan. There is also a section of a Heritage Trail, called the Mountain Dene Trail to Drum Lake, located in the proposed area of the Land Use Permit in question. The Moutain Dene Trail to Drum Lake has been placed in the Conservation Areas category of the preliminary Draft Sahtu Land Use Plan.

The broad land use category termed Special Management Areas is described in the Draft Sahtu Land Use Plan as areas that:

...include intensive traditional use locations, Great Bear Lake, as well as the Mackenzie River corridor. While these areas are to be primarily managed to maintain traditional activities, there is opportunity for surface and/or subsurface

developments in some areas. As such, some specific sites within the special management area may prohibit all forms of development, while in other locations terms and conditions may be placed on the appropriate land use permits, water licenses or other authorizations to conduct work. The specific terms and conditions noted below aim to protect wildlife and their habitats, heritage and cultural values, tourism, and others. Readers should note that many of these terms and conditions are already applied within the Sahtu Settlement Are and are often industry identified "best practices".

The specific Intensive Traditional Use Area of Stewart Lake, Tate Lake and Little Bear River has been identified by Sahtu residents because:

Many wildlife species of special concern are found in these areas, including caribou (barren-ground and mountain), moose, fur-bearers, waterfowl and fish.

The objectives of Intensive Traditional Use Areas are:

To maintain traditional use

To maintain regional travel corridors

To protect heritage and cultural values

To protect burial and archaeological sites

To protect important fish, wildlife and waterfowl habitats

To allow for development while preserving other significant values

The provisions in the preliminary Draft Sahtu Land Use Plan for the Stewart Lake, Tate Lake and Little Bear River Intensive Traditional Use Area allow for commercial industrial development as long as:

 The community and other potentially affected users are consulted about the proposed development and that their concerns are clearly identified and addressed within the proponents' application.

 Appropriate measures are taken to avoid damage to fish, wildlife and their habitats, archaeological, burial and other heritage sites and the general land or water. (Please find the list of these measures in Appendix)

The second area of concern, the Mountain Dene Trail to Drum Lake, has been noted as a Conservation Area. Conservation Areas identified in the planning process are included as such in the preliminary Draft Sahtu Land Use Plan:

Conservation Areas include sites and places with a combination of high traditional, cultural, historical, and/or biological significance. This includes existing and proposed protected areas, most major rivers, International Biological Programme sites, as well as heritage trails, sites and places. The primary goal of the Conservation Areas is to ensure the traditional, cultural, heritage, and biophysical values are maintained. Therefore, all surface and subsurface development activities, except for low impact recreation and tourism, are prohibited on lands designated Conservation Areas. The management of lands within existing protected areas is the responsibility of the appropriate government agency.

Acceptable activities within all Conservation Areas include: Traditional Harvesting Low Impact Tourism and Recreation

Restricted or unacceptable activities within all Conservation Areas include:
Oil and Gas Exploration and Development
Mining Exploration and Development
Commercial Renewable Resources Development
Sand, Gravel and Rock Extraction
Transportation and Infrastructure Development
Waste Disposal
Power Development
Commercial Water Development

In particular, the Mountain Dene Trail to Drum Lake Conservation Area:
...was identified during the planning process as a very important local travel corridor, heritage place and traditional use location. Special features in this conservation area include burial sites and the Mountain Dene Heritage Trail. The full extent of this trail is not yet mapped.

I hope this information is of assistance to you, as the final version of the preliminary Draft Sahtu Land Use Plan is still forthcoming at this time. APPENDIX Preliminary Draft Sahtu Land Use Plan Mitigation Measures for Developments in Special Management Areas

- No fuel storage within 100m of ordinary high-water mark of any water body.
- > No cutting or other disturbance of stream banks.
- Water should be sourced from multiple sources using screened intakes and cannot come from a small lake.
- > Temporary stream crossings must be constructed of clean snow and water.
- > Fuel and oil management plans must be in place prior to the start of operations.
- Frozen water bodies cannot be used as camp sites or transportation routes, nor can any materials be stored on the ice.
- No activity within 150 m of known or suspected archaeological, burial or other heritage sites. If a site is suspected, the Sahtu Land and Water Board, the Sahtu Land Use Planning Board and other appropriate authorities must be informed.
- Trap lines and other traditional use areas must be avoided.
- Any trails crossed must be restored. In particular, barriers to movement of wildlife or people cannot be created.
- Existing cut lines, roads, marshalling yards, and other sites must be used wherever possible.
- Any new clearings must be the minimum size required for the task and should not result in long lines of site.
- All waste products must be removed from the development site. Toxic wastes must be removed from the Mackenzie Valley.
- Departions can only be conducted under suitable ground conditions (i.e. ground must be fully frozen or other wise capable of supporting equipment.
- Work crews cannot hunt or feed wildlife, must limit their vehicles speed and should keep their work areas clean of garbage.
- Minimal ground and vegetation disturbance through hand falling on steep slopes, elevated bulldozer blades and others.
- The timing of the work must be scheduled to avoid wildlife species of concern including caribou and waterfowl migration times as determined by the Sahtu Renewable Resources Board or other appropriate authority.
- > All operations sites are suitably reclaimed.
- > Other terms and conditions may be applied by the regulatory authorities or by the communities.
