Good Morning Martin,

Dene Nation is pleased to have the opportunity to respond to the correspondence you sent us via email. As you are well aware Dene have Aboriginal and Treaty Rights that are recognized in the Canadian Constitution 1982. These rights were defined in Treaties 8 and 11. The nature and extent of Dene treaty rights and title require that your board assess observed and projected Infringements on our lands, rights and title.

Your board must assess the social, economic, as well as environmental impacts. Furthermore, where such infringements are assessed, the Minister you advice must Instruct the developer on measures to reduce the extent of Infringement.

Mitigation efforts must be aimed at reducing the ill effects that Dene might experience as a result of a project and the Cumulative effects from different projects and projects over-time.

Our members are not all in agreement as to the authority of your Agency, we do not all respect the legislation that created and maintain the legitimacy of your agency is in fact not undermining our Treaty and Aboriginal rights. This issue is in dispute. Our members also lack the capacity to respond to the highly technical and legal nature of the correspondence you have sent us. Therefore we will not be reviewing your applications at this time.

Once these issues, related to authority and capacity, have been resolved we will notify you and respond accordingly.
