Preamble

Several potential barge accident or malfunction scenarios other than sinkings could have negative impacts on water quality or other valued components. To assess the likelihood of such scenarios, a review of the past record of barge incidents is warranted.

MVRB Request

Please provide statistical information on past barge incidents in Great Slave Lake or other representative areas, including but not necessarily limited to cargo spills, fuel spills, collisions, groundings, and hull leaks.

Transport Canada's Response:

Transport Canada does not collect statistical information or maintain a database on the number of incidents in marine waters. The Canadian Coast Guard and the Transportation Safety Board amass data on past incidences related to marine shipping.

The Canadian Coast Guard's Regional Marine Information Centers manage and collect information regarding past environmental incidents in arctic marine waters. The Regional Marine Information Centers are the collector and disseminator of marine pollutant spills reports, or land/air based spills that affect the coast.

Detailed statistical information on past fuel spill incidents in arctic marine waters can be provided by the Canadian Coast Guard. Please contact the following for more information:
