Item Description:	This document is the Developer's comments on the Terms of Reference based on the revised Mackenzie Valley Highway project (Wrigley to Norman Wells).
General Reviewer Information:	<p>Reviewers are asked to provide comment on the Developer's comments on the Terms of Reference.</p> <p>Background - The Developer initially applied for an all-season highway from Wrigley to the Dempster highway near Inuvik. Based on this application the Review Board issued the Terms of Reference on Dec 23, 2014. On Aug 29, 2014 the developer submitted a revised project description for an all season highway from Wrigley to Norman Wells. Because the project description changed the Review Board requested that the Developer review the existing Terms of Reference for conformity with the revised project description. The Developer submitted its response on Nov 27, 2014. The purpose of this review is to allow reviewers to provide comment on the Developer's proposed changes to the Terms of Reference.</p> <p>Comments from Reviewers are due by Dec 19. The Developer will then provide its response to Reviewer comments by Jan 23, 2015.</p> <p>The Review Board will consider comments from the Developer and Reviewers when issuing the Terms of Reference for the revised Mackenzie</p>

1	Transport Canada (TC-1) - 7.3.1.2 Culture and traditional land use	<p>Comment Does not address Transport Canada's mandate.</p> <p>Recommendation Describe the results of Aboriginal consultation specifically related to navigation on navigable waterways in the project area.</p>	<p>Jan 28:</p> <p>Comment: Section 2.3 speaks to Aboriginal Consultation. Section 7.3.1.2 (Water quality and quantity) speaks to impacts of the highway on navigable waterbodies. There is no Section 7.3.1.2; however, there is a section on Culture and traditional land use (Section 7.3.13) which states that all sites along the route are to be identified, and this would include navigable water sites and any other site. To identify only one of these sites in this section would not capture the intended holistic intent. Section 7.3.14 (Land Use) also includes "effects to traditional land use, tourism, hunting, fishing, recreation and other non-traditional uses," which would capture navigation of navigable waterbodies. As outlined in Section 7.3.14, the developer will make all reasonable efforts to incorporate traditional knowledge from Aboriginal culture holders as a tool to collect information and evaluate the specific impacts required in this Terms of Reference. Therefore, in order to evaluate navigable waterways in sections 7.3.13 and 7.3.14, the information gathered from aboriginal consultation will be utilized.</p> <p>Recommendation: To ensure navigation on navigable waters is properly addressed, Section 7.3.14 will be expanded upon so that the expansion point will read: Effects to protected areas, parks, navigable waterways, environmentally and culturally sensitive areas.</p>

2	<p>General - Addition of "use"</p>	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) The reviewer has added the term "use" of the road. This is valuable because it implies the routine traffic (e.g., public and commercial) that will "use" the highway. Operation and use have different meanings that needs to be clarified. These terms should be defined.</p> <p>Recommendation The addition of the term "use" should be added in addition to "operations".</p>	
3	<p>Section 3.1 - Scope of Development</p>	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) There needs to be consistency and well defined terms describing scope of highway impacts.</p> <p>Recommendation Scope of work should include the construction, use (e.g., by public etc.), operations (e.g., maintenance), and reclamation of the highway. Clearly defined definitions are required and consistent use of terms is needed.</p>	
4	<p>Section 3.1 - Scope of Development</p>	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has removed "reclamation of highway" from scope (Section 3.1). Reclamation of the highway or sections of the highway may occur if</p>	

		<p>areas of the highway are straighten, for example. It is short-sighted to assume the highway will not change in a relatively short period of time (e.g., 10 years).</p> <p>Recommendation Reclamation of the highway should remain in the TOR (Section 3.1)</p>	
5	Section 3.1 - Scope of Development	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has indicated that ongoing maintenance has an insignificant impact. As previously discussed this not necessarily true as maintenance (i.e. snow plowing, dust suppression material) could effect the environment. It is not the reviewers job to determine "significance" or "non - significance", it is the job of the people completing the EA.</p> <p>Recommendation Potential impacts of maintenance and operation should be included in scope of environment assessment.</p>	
6	Section 3.4 - Temporal Scope	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has removed two paragraphs that describe procedures that should be considered if there is a delay in the project. The reviewer has indicated that paragraphs are not needed because no delays are anticipated. The reviewer has no way of anticipating future events. The paragraphs are important because unforeseen event could impact project. A</p>	

		<p>delay of a season could see a change in both caribou population and migration routes.</p> <p>Recommendation The two removed paragraphs should remain. If there is no delay in project no additional work will be required; however, if there is a delay it reasonable to require that predictions of assessment are revisited.</p>	
7	Section 3.5 - Consideration of Alternatives	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) the TOR requires that the DAR must identify and describe alternative methods of highway construction and operation etc. The reviewer has removed " the DAR must also describe the environmental effects of each alternative method". The reviewer has indicated that the meaning of sentence is capture in the that following sentence. The following sentence states "the relative consideration of environmental effects". The removed sentence has more specific language and this is important and is not redundant.</p> <p>Recommendation Keep the removed sentence as it provides clearer direction.</p>	
8	Section 4.1 - Impact assessment steps	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) The reviewer has removed directions based on the assumption the project will be started immediately. The reviewer cannot predict future events.</p> <p>Recommendation Removed</p>	

		informaton should remain.	
9	Section 5.1.1 -Terrain, geology, soils, and permafrost	Comment (Submitted after Due Date) The reviewer has removed the requirement of describe mitigation measures that will be effective for a changing climate. Describing mitigation seems reasonable. Recommendation This requirement should remain.	
10	Section 6.1 - Project components and activities	Comment (Submitted after Due Date) The reviewer has removed "routine maintenance activites" and "ongoing operations and maintenance of the all weather highway". These are important considerations because these activities will contribute to the long-term effects of a new highway. Operation and maintenance need to be considered. Recommendation As previously stated references to operations and maintenance should remain in TOR.	
11	Section 6.2 - Development phases and schedule	Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has removed the requirement to identify overall capital costs claiming it will skew contract negotiations. Actually it will provide better direction to bidding contractors and allow the preparation of better more informed bids. In addition, the capital cost will be need to evaluate socio-economic impacts. Recommendation Requirement for overall capital costs should remain.	
12	Section 7.2.2	Comment (Submitted after	

	<p>-Caribou, moose and harvesting</p>	<p>Due Date) Review has changed "changes in the quality of harvested species (including contamination) that would negatively affect their consumption" to "Contaminant levels in harvested species that could be changed by highway". The reviewer has assumed that the quality of harvested species is only due to contaminant levels. This is likely untrue. For example, increased traffic could increase stress to wildlife affecting animal condition and negatively affect consumption. All changes in "quality" of species needs to be assessed. Recommendation Original clause should remain unchanged.</p>	
13	<p>Section7.3.4 - Water quality and quantity</p>	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has restricted water quality parameters to turbidity and total suspended solids. Reviewer has assumed that these are the only water quality objectives that will be affected by highway construction and operations. The EA should identify all potential water quality objectives. For example, parameters such as metals and petroleum hydrocarbon might be important in some cases. Recommendation Remove addition referring only to turbidity and TSS</p>	
14	<p>Section 7.3.12 -</p>	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) The reviewer has</p>

This should be dealt with by those completing the EA (i.e., identification of baseline and how to establish, if required).</p> <p>Recommendation Leave Country food section unchanged.</p>	
15	Section 7.3.14 - Land Use	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has removed a requirement for identification of non conformity with the Sahtu Land Use Plan. The EA may identify issues, not previously known, that may not or do not conform with the Sahtu Land Use Plan. It will be easier for EA reviewers and decision makers if these issues are identified and stated clearly so appropriate decisions and possible changes to the project can be made.</p> <p>Recommendation The identification of issues that may not non-conformity should be kept and add a requirement for discussion of non-conformity.</p>	
16	Section 10 - Cumulative Effect Assessment (page 37)	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has replaced highway with project footprint. In introductory paragraph it clearly states with emphasis that the "contribution of the highway to the overall effect" must be considered. It is likely that the largest</p>	

		<p>environmental effects of the project will be the HIGHWAY and will be long-term and potentially significant. The actual construction of the highway will be short-term and likely have a negligible or small effect. It is critical that the ToR directs the proponents of the highway to measure the effects of the HIGHWAY (including maintenance, operations, and use) not just the construction.</p> <p>Recommendation Do not change highway to project footprint.</p>	
17	Section 11 - Follow-up and monitoring	<p>Comment (Submitted after Due Date) Reviewer has removed "and operation"</p> <p>Recommendation This should not be changed.</p>
