

Husky Oil Operations Limited Chedabucto 2015 Drilling Program Great Slave Lake - North Arm Engagement Plan

Background

In 2011 Husky Oil Operations Limited ("Husky") identified a high quality silica mineral deposit on the west side of the North Arm of Great Slave Lake; at a site we are calling Chedabucto. Preliminary assessment of the deposit included field mapping, geophysical surveys and reconnaissance sampling. Laboratory analysis of samples showed that the silica sand is highly suitable for use as proppant in hydraulic fracture stimulation treatments of unconventional oil and gas resource plays. Husky has staked claim through a third party, Aurora Geosciences Ltd. ("Aurora"), to ~40,000 acres of crown land. Subsequent geophysical and samples from a hand auguring work program, determined that there is the potential for a sizable resource in place. The mineral claim has been expanded to 74,000 acres (300 square kilometres).

On January 21, 2014, the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency ("CanNor") hosted a Resource Development Advisory Group ("RDAG") meeting at which Husky was introduced as the owner of the Chedabucto mineral claims and the silica deposit was described to representatives from the Government of Northwest Territories, Government of Canada, Land and Water Boards and the Regulator. Husky utilized the advice provided in this meeting to kickoff engagement with land holders and potentially affected persons.

Husky reached out to potentially affected Aboriginal groups in an introductory letter on February 18, 2014. The letter contained background information on the Chedabucto silica deposit and a request to meet face-to-face. Meetings were subsequently arranged between the T'licho Government – Kwe Beh Working Group, the Yellowknives Dene First Nation ("YKDFN") and the North Slave Métis Alliance ("NSMA"); the Akaitcho IMA Office and NWT Métis Nation asked to be kept informed of our activity, but did not feel face-to-face meetings were required at this time. Being new to operating in the region, the intent of the introductory meetings was to provide information on who Husky is, to describe the claim area and to seek guidance on how best to proceed with engagement. Tables 1a, 1b and 1c provide a chronology of engagement with these groups. Key messages were received at the introductory and subsequent meetings including:

- There is a long history of use of this area by each the of groups;
- Each of the groups want to conduct preliminary Traditional Knowledge studies for the Chedabucto claim area:
- Appreciation that exploration of the claims is required to assess the potential for commercial development;
- Concerns over what the impact of commercial development will be and how the resource extraction will conducted;
- Strong desire by each of the groups to participate in and benefit from any development of resources in area;

- Concerns were expressed about the risks involved with hydraulic fracture stimulation treatments being employed by the oil and gas industry; and
- Would silica sand from this project be used for and improve the economics of the Sahtu oil shale resource development; and
- Given the early stage of exploration, it would be premature for Husky to conduct community visits for the 2015 drilling program.

In response, Husky initiated Archaeology and Traditional Knowledge studies. Elders from the T'licho Government, YKDFN and NSMA the groups participated in site visits. Verbal responses were provided for the hydraulic fracture treatment risk concerns; Husky is working with the Government of the Northwest Territories and the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers ("CAPP") to have an information workshop on the oil and gas industry made available to the groups in 2015. Regarding plans for development; it is early days in the exploration of the Chedabucto silica deposit and it is premature to speculate on what commercial development will entail. Husky is committed to transparency and has assured the groups that should the exploration program determine that there is a potentially commercial project, extensive engagement will be essential part of formulating a Development Plan. The Chedabucto silica deposit is not being evaluated solely for the Sahtu oil shale play but could a source of proppant for resource play operations south of the 60th parallel was well.

At face-to-face meetings in September, Husky presented and discussed draft Engagement Plans (Tables 1a, 1b and 1c) with representatives from each of the respective Aboriginal groups. The representatives were asked share the draft Plans with their leadership and forward any comments, suggestions or changes to Cheryl McLean at Husky. Follow up emails were sent to each of the groups December 2nd, but, to date no comments or suggested changes have been received from any of the groups. The enclosed Engagement Plans (Tables 1a, 1b and 1c) are living documents and we expect that they will be updated from time to time.

Husky also had information sessions regarding the Chedabucto silica deposit with the NWT & Nunavut Chamber of Mines, NWT Chamber of Commerce and the Dinàgà Wek'ehodi Candidate Protected Area Working Group. In September, the NSMA hosted Husky representatives on a cultural retreat at their established camp at Old Fort Rae. Also in September, Husky sponsored, and personnel participated in, Įłàà Katì - a Traditional Knowledge Symposium hosted by the T'licho Government in Yellowknife.

Prior to submission of the Land Use Permit application, Husky met with representatives of the T'licho Government – Kwe Beh Working Group, the YKDFN and NSMA. A copy of the presentation that was used to provide details the 2015 drilling program is enclosed along with the Record of Engagement.



Husky is committed to comprehensive, meaningful, and ongoing engagement with stakeholders and, most specifically, with land holders and potentially affected persons. In preparation for submitting this application, Husky has developed and implemented an engagement plan that seeks to identify and mitigate concerns raised by stakeholders, and maximize opportunities and benefits in the region. The engagement plan will guide Husky's activities by ensuring that affected stakeholders are identified; key issues and concerns are identified and addressed; and, where reasonable and feasible, feedback is incorporated back into project planning.

To date, Husky has held a number of face-to-face meetings and information sessions regarding the Chedabucto silica deposit.

On January 21, 2014, the Canadian Northern Economic Development Agency ("CanNor") hosted a Resource Development Advisory Group ("RDAG") meeting at which Husky was introduced as the owner of the Chedabucto mineral claims and the silica deposit was described to representatives from the Government of Northwest Territories, Government of Canada, and Land and Water Boards. Husky utilized the advice provided in this meeting to kick-off engagement with land holders and potentially affected persons.

Husky sent out an introductory letter on February 18, 2014 to the following organizations to introduce the company, the silica prospect, and future explorations plans:

In the letter, Husky also requested an in-person meeting with each of the organizations and received an invitation from three Aboriginal organizations: the T'licho Government / Kwe Beh Working Group (KBWG); the North Slave Métis Alliance (NSMA); and the Yellowknives Dene First Nation (YKDFN). These meetings provided Husky with guidance on how best to proceed with engagement with each of the three organizations. Husky then followed up with face-to-face introductory meetings and continued with a series of engagement sessions. Prior to each face-to-face meeting, Husky initiated numerous phone calls to designated Aboriginal organizations, informing them that Husky would be in the community, and to coordinate schedules that would provide the greatest exposure to Husky's plans for the proposed Program. Listed below is a summary of the meetings held with each organization.

T'licho Government

During email and phone correspondence with the T'licho Government representatives it was identified that Kwe Beh Working Group (KBWG) would be the designated organization to meet with Husky. Husky representatives first met with board members of the KBWG at their office in Yellowknife on March 17, 2014. Representing KBWG at this meeting was Henry Zoe, Noel Bishop, Sonny Zoe, John B. Zoe, and Ginger Gibson. Activity maps were shared, samples of proppant were displayed, and Husky delivered a PowerPoint presentation detailing the company overview, the Chedabucto Silica Deposit and evaluation, and plans for future engagement. Questions were encouraged throughout the meeting and discussion topics included the current sand market, potential impacts from development, and traditional land use in the project area.

Following the introductory meeting, Husky met with the KBWG at their office in Yellowknife on May 27, 2014. Husky delivered a PowerPoint presentation and distributed hard copies to attendees. Topics discussed during the meeting included Husky's meeting with the staff of the Wek'èezhìi Land and Water Board, the timing of the delineation drilling program. There was also an in-depth discussion about the next steps to initiate a Traditional Knowledge (TK) study and finalize the Engagement Plan. The KBWG was to provide Husky with a budget and scope of work for the TK study by the end of June. The KBWG also stated that T'licho Lands Department has a newsletter to communicate with Chiefs who then go to communities. They advised Husky that it is premature to meet broadly with the communities at this time.

Husky arranged to meet with the KBWG on September 12, 2014 to review the finalized project scope. In attendance were Henry Zoe, John B. Zoe, Sjoerd van der Weilen (Department of Culture & Lands), and Marjorie Matheson-Maund. Husky provided a copy of the engagement plan in advance of the meeting for their review. The PowerPoint presentation detailed the proposed program including the location and number of drilling locations. The KBWG confirmed that the Lands Department will review the Engagement Plan and provide comments.

Yellowknives Dene First Nation

Husky representatives first met with members of the YKDFN Land and Environment Committee (LEC) in N'dilo on April 10, 2014. Representing YKDFN-LEC at this meeting was Bobby Drygeese, Blake Rasmussen, Diane Betsina, Fred Sangris, Angus Martin, Julia Lynn, Leroy Betsina, Edward Doctor, and Ricky Drygeese. In addition, Todd Slack, Johanne Black, and Randy Freeman represented YKDFN staff. 




Chedabucto Summary

Opportunity

- Frac sand is a significant cost component for multistage hydraulic fracture stimulations of horizontal wells



Chedabucto Prospect - Summary

Description and Location

- Staked Claim ~40,000 acres located 50 km west of Yellowknife, NWT
- Deposit consists of silica in two stratigraphic horizons
 - Holocene unconsolidated silica sand overlying Cambrian Mt. Clark Fm. or Precambrian bedrock
 - Insitu Cambrian Mt. Clark Fm. silica sandstone
- Located on open Crown Land with overlapping claims by Tlicho, Akaitcho, Dehcho
- Deposit is located on Great Slave Lake with access to barging to Norman Wells and Hay River CN rail line to Southern markets
- Deposit is bounded to East and North by Great Slave Lake and to South and West by wetland and Devonian/Ordovician escarpment (approximately 30 m in height)

Stim Lab Analysis Results – derived from more than 45 samples of Holocene

- Analysis revealed that samples passed API/ISO crush, acid solubility and roundness and sphericity, conductivity

Recommendations/Key Points:

- Husky provided a PowerPoint presentation and distributed hard copies to attendees which gave a very early introduction to its exploration project, with a good description of the need/goals of the exploration activities. Details on the level of disturbance (i.e. number of holes) were not provided, nor was specific areas.
- 2. Husky (through Aurora Geoscience) initially staked a small area undertook preliminary exploration, then staked a larger area (The Land Withdrawal for the North Arm Protected area came into force in the meantime, hence the boundary of the new areas conforming to the PAS boundary).
- Husky acknowledged that the area has specific sensitivities regarding traditional use and heritage resources. Golder is the project's consultant, has undertaken a desktop study to date. Randy Freeman acknowledged that he had received an application from Golder to conduct an archaeological study.
- 4. YKDFN members wanted to see traditional knowledge for the area gathered and incorporated into project plan prior to disturbance. Additionally, TK specialist emphasized that the significant

cultural locations on their maps and databases are not to be viewed as exact locations – they're inaccurate and represent the use of the landscape.

- 5. Chief Fred Sangis questioned how Husky had consulted with Mr. David Etchinelle of Tulita, as he had been told that Husky had not consulted with Mr. Etchinelle. Ken Hansen responded that while Husky was active in that the Keele River area that we had met frequently with Mr. Etchinelle, opened a road his to cabin at Stewart Lake, that his wife had translated and given cultural awareness sessions for Husky, and that his sons had worked on the Husky project. Husky's Slater River project does not directly impact Mr. Etchinelle, but that he had attended public consultations held in Tulita.
- 6. YKDFN asked if the company is willing to accept 'NO' as an answer otherwise this isn't a real conversation. Ken Hansen agreed, indicating that they want and need a social license to operate. If the community is going to say 'no', they want to hear it now when they don't have much investment. Without support they aren't willing to look at activities beyond the exploration permit.

Follow Up Required:

- a. Land and Environment Committee provided recommendations to YKDFN Chief and Council. This was completed April 22nd. C&C direction to Husky will be provided following meeting between C&C and Husky.
- b. Husky indicated that this was the beginning of the engagement, with additional efforts planned in the future as their plans advance towards a permit submission in late winter 2015. This is to be completed as and when the project moves forward (Staff notes state: 'Application in approx. 9 months, drilling in 2015 assuming there is support').
 NOTE: There is a small discrepancy with this follow up Husky indicated that they stated that the application would be submitted late summer/fall of 2014, with exploration being conducted in late winter/early spring of 2015. This was not noted in the record of the meeting and is an


